Elvio Cogno gets many awards from the major Italian wine guides of 2012

Novello (CN) 20/09/2011 - The most important Italian wine guides have awarded **Elvio Cogno company** for the **2012 season**.



The **Gambero Rosso "Guida Vini d'Italia 2012"** confirms the **3 glasses** to **Barolo Ravera 2007 DOCG**. In 2011 the award went to Barolo Bricco Pernice 2005.

Saturday, October the 22nd 2011, the owners of the winery Elvio Cogno will be in Rome to receive the desirable certificate from the editors Marco Sabellico, Eleonora Guerini and Gianni Fabrizio.

The **L'Espresso "I Vini d'Italia 2012"** has added **Barolo Bricco Pernice 2006 DOCG** among the **Wines of Excellence** in the first pages of the guide, edited by Ernesto Gentili and Fabio Rizzari. The Wines of Excellence, that is the high-level wines, have scores between 18 and 20 (the top score). These are the wines that have excited more than others the tasters. Among the Wines of Excellence of 2011 appeared the Barolo Vigna Elena 2004 DOCG. The ceremony of presentation of the L'Espresso guide will be October the 6th 2011 at the historic St. Lorenzo Market in Florence. The Barolo awarded will be available for the official tasting.



The list of the prices continues with the **5 grappoli** of **Bibenda "Duemilavini"**, the guide edited by **AIS** - Association of Italian Sommeliers - for **Barolo Bricco Pernice 2006 DOCG**. This year the guide will be translated into English under the title "Bibenda Wine. The Italian Wine Guidebook" distributed all around the world thanks to the Worldwide Sommelier Association. Monday, October the 31st in Rome, a major gala dinner will celebrate the award-winning wines and the publication of the guide, in Franco Maria Ricci's presence.

Slow Food Editore also reported that the guide "**Slow Wine 2012. Stories of life, vineyards, wine in Italy**" has reserved two important symbols to the winery: **the snail**, which is assigned only to wineries that share the same values as Slow Food and "**Great Wine**" to **Barolo Ravera 2007**, rated among the best bottles according to the organoleptic profile.

Excellence in the Italian Wine Guide 2012**" written in two languages - English and Italian - from the editors **D'Agata and Comparini**. Last year, the authors included the Barolo Ravera 2006 DOCG with an outstanding score of 93/100 among the 150 best Italian wines.
